Taking up the challenge we all decided to start our classes from 3rd of April as announced earlier. The first week was bit confusing for everyone. Video recorded lessons were shared by teachers through various mediums to benefit the students residing in remote areas with connectivity issue. I am extremely thankful to the Head Office for providing us support during Covid times.

Schools went into lockdown in March 2020 while the final assessments were still going on. We started with the online classes almost at that time. The major challenge was to bring all students to attend classes regularly and getting the tasks completed. Other challenges included poor network, availability of devices, submission and correction of written work, giving feedback to students on the assignments and to ensure participation in the online class. But with correct strategies and mutual cooperation we overcame it all! Zoom & Google meet are being used mostly by teachers. Teachers are giving online quizzes to practice the concepts covered. Students record videos of their work and send to the class teachers. Class teachers share these videos with other teachers and parents in the panel to view the work and give feedback.

The major challenge faced by the school is in the domain of network and connectivity. Again, the online teaching apps like Zoom and Google meet aren't compatible on everyone's systems. For this reason, screen recordings of the zoom classes are being shared on WhatsApp. Teachers repeat the summary of the lesson in a video and then it is shared with those who couldn't attend the classes; worksheets were also shared. Unit tests were also conducted with the complete strength.

The most significant challenge that has been in the past months is engaging our students on this online platform effectively. Some of our efforts were training the teachers for online classes and making them comfortable with the use of technology and the successful handling of digital glitches if they face while teaching.

Organizations like PARAKH (Performance Assessment Review and Analysis of Knowledge for Holistic Development) will help boards of Assessments to standardize and share the best practices. This when coupled with NTA (National Testing Agency) which will conduct tests to make a bridge between the schools and colleges by testing the right skills and providing a quality score card, will serve multiple purposes.
