JAIPURIA CONDUCTS SCHOOL AUDIT 2020










Even before the Covid-19 crisis forced us to change our ways and means of dissemination and learning of knowledge, there was a need to rethink our one-size-fits-all approach to education.

This policy envisages that the extant 10+2 structure in school education will be modified with a new pedagogical and curricular restructuring of 5+3+3+4 covering ages 3-10.

The key benefit of overall thrust of curriculum and pedagogy reform across all stages is to move the education system towards real understanding and away from the culture of rote learning. Curriculum content will be reduced in each subject to its core essentials, to make space for critical thinking.

Students will be given increased flexibility and choice of subjects to study.

The policy ideates to instil a sense of responsibility and self-evaluation, a welcoming and much-needed change!

The greater focus of NEP is on experiential learning – a key element in international education and curriculum options. Bloom's Taxonomy for the 21st century learners under the NEP has taken a 360 degree change with creativity at its highest echelon and developing this creativity shall revolutionise the Indian Education System. This means better real-life training and enhanced skill sets for the learners.

The key feature of NEP is that there will be no hard separation in the streams like science and humanities. Subjects like arts, music, crafts, sports, yoga etc will be a part of the curriculum. This will help the students to develop scientific temper at a young age. The NEP will promote skill-based education and enhance the practical skills of the students. 'Coding' will be included for students of class VI and upwards. Sanskrit will be a part of the curriculum.

Some of NEP's benefits and features are:

- 1.Class 10 and 12 board examinations to be made easier, to test the core competencies rather than memorised facts, with all students allowed to take the exam twice.
- 2.A new and comprehensive National Curriculum Framework for Teacher Education (NCFTE) 2021 will be formulated by NCTE in consultation with NCERT.
- 3. Affiliation of colleges is to be phased out in 15 years and a stage-wise mechanism is to be established for granting graded autonomy to colleges.



The National Education Policy 2020, which was approved by the Union Cabinet of India on 29 July 2020, outlines the vision of India's new education system. The new policy replaces the previous National Policy on Education, 1986.



IMPACT AND BENEFITS OF NEW EDUCATION POLICY FOR STUDENTS AND TEACHERS



NEP 2020 marks the beginning of the much-needed change in the Indian education system. The new 5+3+3+4 formula will enable regular assessments of a child's academic performance by National Standardized Testing and also reduce curriculum content to focus more on critical thinking and experiential learning. Far more than creating academic whizzes, the policy aims to inculcate life-skills, ethics, creativity, and human values in students. NEP will also enrich the teaching profession by introducing scholarships to attract teaching talents, revving up teacher eligibility tests and providing platforms for teacher skill development.



NEP 2020 promises to introduce sweeping reforms that have been long due in Indian education. Its most salient feature is to ensure universal access to education at all levels. The policy marks a decisive shift from rote learning to in-depth understanding of concepts through a restructuring of the curriculum and the assessment criteria. On the one hand, NEP will enrich early childhood care and education by creating a robust framework for foundational learning; on the other, it will transform the four-year multidisciplinary undergraduate programme by giving students a

greater flexibility in choice of streams. If implemented well, NEP may make India a

knowledge superpower in the decades ahead.
